Singer/Songwriter Jeff Vitelli is an independent openly gay artist who's recently been seen performing in the Philadelphia area. His CD "The Music Will Not Stop" can be found on most online stores including itunes. Recorded at Morning Star Studio with producer Dave Gerhart and grammy award winning engineer Glenn Barrett, the CD contains original material that showcases a voice often described as soulful.

Jeff has a long history in the music world and started out in the New York Broadway production of the Musical "Nine" in 1983. Over the years he's performed in numerous theater productions. He is a graduate of the Philadelphia High School for Creative and Performing Arts where he studied voice.

Although his background was in theater and classical singing, Jeff has always had a deep interest in Gospel, Jazz, R&B and soul music. His influences include artist like Patti Labelle, Stevie Wonder and The Pointer Sisters. Jeff spent most of his adult life in the south and eventually moved to New Orleans where he sang with the group ELS covering Motown classics and artists like Al Green and Stevie Wonder.

After Hurricane Katrina in 2005, Jeff relocated to Philadelphia and recorded his CD "The Music Will Not Stop" featuring pop, dance and R&B material. Over the past year Jeff has stepped back on the stage and has made appearances at Voyeur Night Club in Philadelphia and The Raven in New Hope. He is also a member of the Philadelphia Gay Men's Chorus.
